WHAT WILL YOU DO IN EACH ONE, TEACH ONE?

As a student in the program, you will meet once a week to learn culturally responsive social justice and equity best practices as well as engaging activities for youth. Once a month, you will go to a TUSD elementary school class to share some of the activities you have developed as part of the Each One Teach One program.

WHO IS EACH ONE, TEACH ONE FOR?

This self-selection program is open to all TUSD high school junior and senior students of color in a Career and Technical Education (CTE) program to participate in.

WHAT WILL YOU GAIN FROM EACH ONE, TEACH ONE?

- Take a course through the University of Arizona
- Gain real-world experience by developing and sharing activities and presentations in an elementary school classroom
- Learn and share knowledge about your community and culture
- Participating students are asked to consider this as they design lessons:
 - What topics do you wish would have been part of your elementary school curriculum?
 - In what ways do you wish you would have had the opportunity to learn in elementary school?
